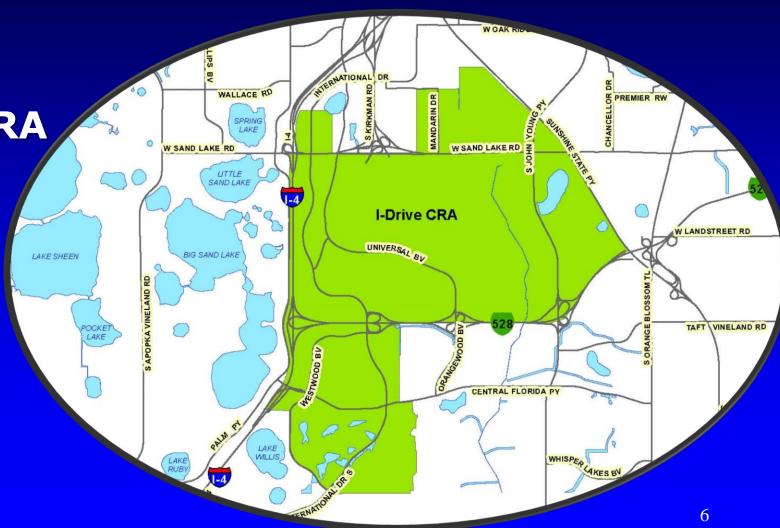

- Focused on Transportation-related Blight
- Redevelopment Plan Adopted in 1998
 - Amended in 2006, 2009, and 2019
 - Included list of redevelopment activities
 - Transportation strategies and projects
 - Recently amended in 2021





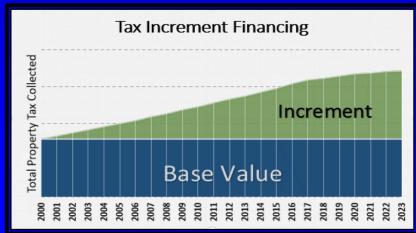
BACKGROUND

- CRA's Funded by Tax Increment Financing (TIF)
- Based on taxable value of properties within CRA
- Capture growth of ad valorem tax revenues within CRA
 - Taxes frozen at base year of CRA establishment (1998)

- Incremental growth of taxes in subsequent years (TIF) is

used to fund projects

- Dedicate those funds to specific improvements within CRA
- FY 20 Tax Increment \$22M

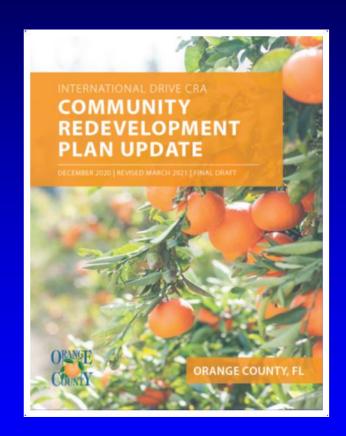
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REDEVELOPMENT PLAN UPDATE

- Approved by BCC/CRA June 8, 2021
 - Expands use of CRA Revenues
 - Maintains 2028 Sunset Date
 - Caps CRA Revenues \$22M annually
- Projected Revenues: \$257M

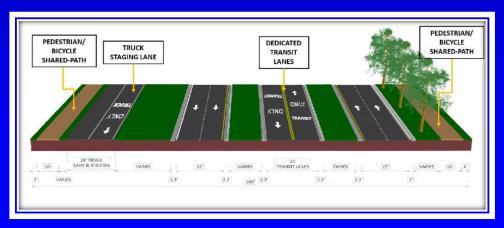

- Targeted to low-income homeowners (80% of Area Median Income)
- Priority given to elderly, disabled or living on fixed income
- Priority given to major code violations creating health and safety issues

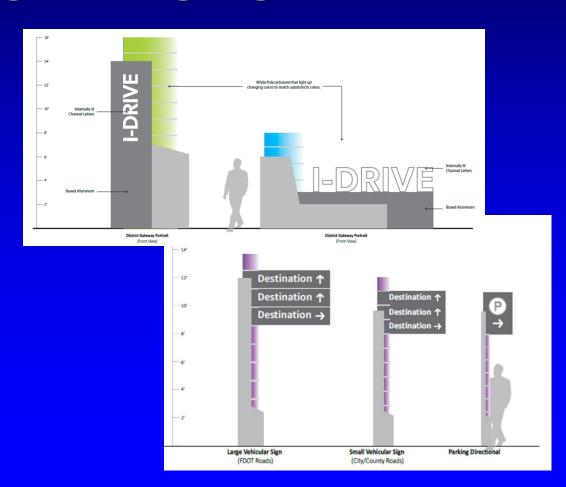
